Employment	Employment assistance and temporary work allowances	<p>1. Post-natural disaster temporary work allowances: CLA shall provide allowances for 700 temporary disaster-stricken home cleaning jobs (NT\$100/hour per person for up to 176 hours per month and 3 months maximum.)</p> <p>2. 0808 Temporary Work Project: CLA shall provide work allowances at NT\$100/hour for people in disaster-stricken areas to clean up their homes. The pay is calculated by the day and remitted at the end of each day for up to one month. The Council shall also cover the labor insurance and national health insurance premiums for these people.</p>	<p>1. Post-natural disaster temporary work allowances: From Aug. 7 to the morning of Sep. 2, 398 people in total already started work.</p> <p>2. As of Sep. 2, 92 towns and townships already assigned work for a total of 110,073 people.</p>

<p>Job Training and Placement for young people in disaster-stricken areas</p>	<p>CLA provides free food and boarding as well as job training for employed workers in disaster-stricken areas. The fields of training include dining, computer, electrical engineering and construction industries. So far 13 courses have been planned and expansion shall be made depending on the circumstances. Workers of certain specific statuses may apply for an extra living allowance.</p>	<p>As of Sep. 2, 2009, Tainan Training Center already opened two training courses – “Home Plumbing, wiring and AC Repairing Class” and “Construction Category: Masonry Class” – and took in 52 people. The remaining courses shall be opened one after another depending on the enrollment.</p>
<p>Application for 6-month deferral of capital and interest payment for people in disaster-stricken areas carrying “The Phoenix Program Micro-Business Startup Loans”</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. CLA shall provide immediate relief assistance to people in disaster-stricken areas carrying “Micro-enterprise Startup Loans”, “The Phoenix Program Small Business Startup Loans for Women” or “The Phoenix Program Micro-Business Startup Loans” by allowing loan capital and interest payment deferral for six months.</li> <li>2. Loan borrowers with a “disaster victim certificate” issued by a county/city government or town/township office may apply to the original lender bank for deferral from Aug. 8, 2009 to Feb. 8, 2010.</li> </ol>	<p>Record shows there were ten borrowers of the Phoenix Loans in the Kaohisung and Pingtung region whose homes have been damaged in the disaster. So far one of them has acquired a disaster victim certificate and applied to the bank for payment deferral.</p>

	<p>Collection of overdue insurance premiums is suspended in the disaster-stricken areas</p>	<p>Deferral of insurance premium payment and exemption of overdue fines are granted in the disaster-stricken areas.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Labor insurance and employment insurance premiums: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Insured units in disaster-stricken areas need not apply. The Bureau of Labor Insurance shall process it automatically. Insured units that are not in a disaster-stricken area are required to present a disaster victim certificate and apply individually.</li> <li>b. The Bureau of Labor Insurance has already permitted deferral of payment of the insurance premiums for the month of June 2009 as well as exemption of overdue fines for 9,709 insured units in disaster-stricken areas.</li> </ol> </li> <li>2. Labor retirement pension premium appropriation: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Appropriating units in disaster-stricken areas need not apply. The Bureau of Labor Insurance shall process it automatically. Appropriating units that are not in disaster-stricken areas are required to present a disaster victim certificate and apply individually.</li> <li>b. The Bureau of Labor Insurance has permitted deferral of appropriation for labor retirement pension premiums for the month of May 2009 for 4,930 appropriating units in disaster-stricken areas. During the deferral period, no overdue fines shall be imposed.</li> </ol> </li> </ol>
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
